

Proposals submission: proposers should submit their abstracts by filling-in the form downloadable at http://www.eugeo2013.com/docs/Eugeo2013_form.doc and sending it to info@eugeo2013.com. Proposals will include the name/affiliation/contacts of the proposers, the title and abstract for the session/panel/event, a description of the format, the name of the potential chair(s) and/or discussant(s) (not compulsory), other information which help the Congress organizers in the selection of proposals. Accepted languages are English and French.

The Congress especially encourages proposals that:

- are organized by experts/researchers of different national origin.
- maximise the diffusion of results through, for example, their publication in special issues or books.
- include early-career researchers as organisers and/or speakers.
- include contributions from both the academia and external experts or policy-makers.
- propose innovative formats.
- are focused on specific regions or countries.
- refer to one or more established research networks.

Key dates:

- 31st December 2012: deadline for proposal to be submitted
- January 2013: communication of acceptance and publication of calls for papers
- March 2013: deadline for abstracts to be submitted
- May 2013: publication of the conference programme

Responsibilities of the session organizers: proposers of accepted sessions will assist the Scientific Committee in circulating the call for papers and in promoting the Congress' activities among their personal networks and mailing lists. They will be responsible, in collaboration with the Congress' organisers, for the selection of abstracts, the invitation of speakers, chair(s) and discussant(s), and in deciding the format of their session.
